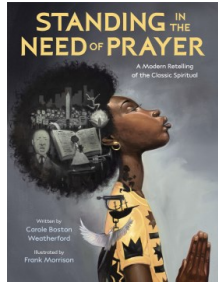


Opal Lee and What It Means to Be Free

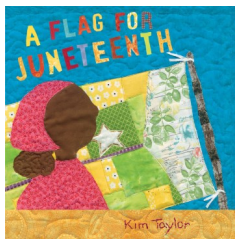


Standing the Need of Prayer
